Johann Sebastian Bach, the great composer, was born on this day in 1685. J.S. Bach, today regarded as, perhaps, the greatest composer of all time, was not famous in his own time.

He spent most of his career as a church musician. He once stated: "The aim and final end of all music should be none other than the glory of God and the refreshment of the soul." He came from a well to do musically inclined family and four of his sons became well known composers.

Today is also National Quilting Day. Quilting is the art of sewing together several layers of cloth and/or stuffing to make a thicker fabric. In America, in the late 18<sup>th</sup> century, this was used to make blankets or wall hangings with intricate designs. Designs (of flowers, etc) were cut from expensive fabrics from Europe and sewn onto less expensive cloth to make the quilts. This was usually done for the more wealthy women to show off in their homes. Later, as people migrated to the West, the art of quilting was taken along. Sometimes quilting was used as an acceptable social outlet for women. They would gather at a neighbor's house to help with the quilting, exchange quilting patterns and to just socialize. During the years prior to the civil war some quilts were made as propaganda for the abolition of slavery. During the civil war women from both sides made quilts to sell to raise money for the war, or to give to the soldiers. After the civil war some women (both white and black) made quilts that told the story of their lives or of an important event. The Amish started making quilts at the end of the 19<sup>th</sup> century. Their quilts were of very fine workmanship and highly prized. Interest in quilting began to die off at the beginning of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. However, the great depression brought back quilting, often as a necessity. People were very poor, so worn clothing was cut into pieces and used for the designs or the stuffing for quilts. These quilts were used as blankets and furniture coverings. After World War II, there was less interest in quilting until about the 1970's. Quilting is making a comeback as a way to display a woman's skills in sewing and design. Some examples of quilting are shown in the pictures above.
